

News flash: Hong Kong and China Gas (3 HK) – Official Opening of Underground Salt-Cavern Gas Storage

(7 November 2018) The Hong Kong and China Gas Co Ltd ("Towngas") is pleased in announcing that its underground salt-cavern gas storage at Jintan, Jiangsu Province, China has officially opened and commenced operation. This marks China's first underground salt-cavern gas storage facility built by a city-gas enterprise.

The Towngas China Jintan Gas Storage provides a total storage capacity of about one billion cubic metres with 22 gas wells constructed in three phases. The current commencement of the first phase with three wells offers a storage capacity of about 100 million cubic metres and provides a maximum daily capacity of 5 million cubic metres.

The underground gas storage will provide emergency peak shaving supply for Eastern China area and the rest of the country and therefore will help to provide sufficient natural gas supply to Towngas' companies. The storage could enable us to leverage on seasonal fluctuation in gas prices in our acquisition, storage and supply of gas so that greater economic benefits will be achieved for our Group.
