

Towngas Celebrates Mid-Autumn Festival with Hong Kong Community 230,000 Mooncakes Distributed to The Less Fortunate

(11 September 2010) Organized by The Hong Kong and China Gas Company Limited (Towngas), Mooncakes for the Community took place for the tenth consecutive year during the Mid-Autumn Festival. Having gained tremendous support since its inception, the activity this year had the help of over 520 legislative council members and district council members, together with 55 charitable organisations, who provided backing and support in the distribution of over 230,000 mooncakes to the elderly and the less fortunate in the community. The programme aims to bring warmth and care during this festive time to different groups within Hong Kong.

This year, Towngas achieved a new high, breaking last year's record with the distribution of more than 230,000 mooncakes in total. Many of these mooncakes were distributed with the help of legislative council members and district council members, to the elderly living alone in public housing estates. The remaining mooncakes were distributed to the less fortunate, including elderly singletons, people with disabilities, low income families and single parent families, with the help and support of various non-profit making organizations. This act of love helps to spread care and warmth, enabling everyone in the community to enjoy a happy mid-autumn festival.

"The Towngas Mooncakes for the Community campaign brings both Towngas and the community together. With help from the different districts, this is the tenth consecutive year that Towngas has organized this meaningful event, distributing mooncakes to spread the message of love and care to those in need", commented James Kwan Yuk-choi, Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer of Towngas.





On 11 September 2010, Towngas also hosted a large-scale mooncake festival at the Chan Shu Kui Community Hall located on Java Road in North Point. Children both from Hong Kong and South East Asia presented handmade lanterns and mooncakes to each other to spread this message of love and care across the district and beyond.
